

MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS

Medical appointments should be made outside of school hours where possible. Where it is not possible, you must notify the office in advance. Taking your child out of school is disruptive for the class and impacts your child's learning and attendance.

If there are concerns about how much time your child is missing, proof of medical appointments will be required.

TERM TIME HOLIDAYS

Holidays must not be taken during term time as this has an extremely detrimental effect on your child's education. A fixed penalty notice is the least of the costs; it is the impact on your child's future educational success that presents the greatest cost.

We urge you to prioritise the long term benefits of regular school attendance over the short term impact of a holiday.

TOP TIPS

FOR YOU AND YOUR CHILD

ONLINE SAFETY



This week's free online safety guide, provided by the National College, focuses on 'Trolling and Online Abuse'. Trolling is a form of 'cyber-aggression'. It involves the sending of malicious, abusive or derogatory messages by one user (a 'troll') to another user online with the intention of upsetting or harassing them or damaging their reputation. It is often anonymous and does not meet the definition of bullying yet might develop into online bullying.

If you are a victim of 'trolling' NOS advocate: Reporting the incident to the platform, collecting as much evidence as possible and seeking professional advice.

SAFEGUARDING



Social Media

Recently, there has been media discussion about the new Netflix drama Adolescence, which explores the 'incel' movement (involuntary celibacy). Incels believe they cannot form relationships due to factors like appearance or societal structures. Some online forums promote this ideology and even encourage violence against women. It's important to monitor the content children access and have open conversations about their online activity. Staying informed helps keep them safe.


