

ONLINE SAFET

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This week's free online safety guide, provided by the National College, focuses on focuses on

<u>'How to set up parental controls on iPhones to limit content and ensure that is age-appropriate'.</u>

The parental controls on iPhones allow you to block or restrict certain apps, features, content, downloads, or purchases. Setting limitations on content ratings, Siri and web searches enables you to filter out ageinappropriate content and vastly reduce the likelihood of your children being exposed to unsuitable material and information.

SAFEGUARDING

Operation Encompass

This week our focus is on Operation Encompass. This is a police and education early information sharing partnership enabling schools to offer immediate support for children experiencing the impact of domestic abuse. Information is shared by the police with a school's trained Key Adult (DSL) prior to the start of the next school day when officers have attended a domeštic abuse incident. Children experiencing domestic abuse are negatively impacted by this exposure; with domestic abuse identified as an Adverse Childhood Experience (ACE). Operation Encompass aims to mitigate this harm by enabling immediate support and thus making the child's day better.


WHAT IS IT
