If there are concerns about how much time your child is missing, proof of medical appointments will be required.

## ONLINE SAFET



This week's free online safety quide, provided by the National College, focuses on <u>Tik Tok</u>. The popular videosharing social media app allows users to create, view and download looping 15second clips. Typically, these are videos of users lip-syncing and dancing to popular songs enhanced with filters, effects and text. Designed with young people in mind (but carrying an age rating of 13<sup>+</sup>), Tik Tok skyrocketed in popularity in 2019 and now boasts approximately a billion users worldwide. Despite the fun nature of Tik Tok, there are numerous hazards which parents should be aware of.

## SAFEGUARDING



#### Mental Health

This week's safequarding focus is mental health. Mental health is about our moods, feelings and emotions. Recognising the signs that a child may be struggling with their mental health can be really hard and it is important that we talk about mental health and normalise this talk with the children. - Take it seriously and explore the feelings together.
- Offer empathy rather than solutions.
