MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS

Medical appointments should be made outside of school hours where possible. Where it is not possible, you must notify the office in advance. Taking your child out of school is disruptive for the class and impacts your child's learning and attendance.

If there are concerns about how much time your child is missing, proof of medical appointments will be required.

TERM TIME

Holidays must not be taken during term time as this has an extremely detrimental effect on your child's education. A fixed penalty notice is the least of the costs; it is the impact on your child's future educational success that presents the greatest cost.

We urge you to prioritise the long term benefits of regular school attendance over the short term impact of a holiday.

TOP TIPS

FOR YOU AND YOUR CHILD

ON THE SAFETY



This week's free online safety quide, provided by the National College, focuses on the video-sharing app '<u>W App'</u>. Developed in Germany, this social networking app, sometimes branded as 'Slay" in some territories, is aimed primarily at teens. Marketed as a zero-negativity" zone, it asks users to connect with others from their school. They are then asked a positive question (such as "Who is the nicest person?") and shown four people from their school to choose from. All users from a school can appear in the poll: not just those a child is friends with. The app is mainly anonymous - but does offer clues to reveal who selected you for each question.

SAFEGUARDING



Radicalisation At Masefield, the safety and well-being of our pupils is our top priority. As part of this, we want to raise awareness about radicalisation and how we can work together to protect young minds. Radicălisation is the process where someone is influenced to adopt extreme beliefs or ideologies that can lead to harmful actions.
