






Year 4 trip @MasefieldCP

Attendance Update

Our 97% target is still achievable this year if we all work together on ensuring children are in school EVERY day and not missing any learning.

Appointments

We ask that medical appointments are made outside of school hours where possible.

Where it is not possible to avoid this in school time you must notify the office beforehand.

Taking your child out in school time not only disrupts the class but also impacts their learning and attendance.

If there are concerns regarding the amount of time your child is missing then proof of all future appointments will be requested.



Holidays in Term Time

Holidays must not be taken during term time as this has an extremely detrimental effect on your child's education.

The long-term cost to your child's education of going on holiday in term time, far outweighs the short term gain of the holiday at the time. The £60 fixed penalty notice is the least of the costs; it is the impact on your child's future educational success that presents the greatest cost. Children miss vital learning that cannot be repeated. It is widely acknowledged that mental health and personal well-being flourish when children have good routines and engage with their learning. Holidays in term time are disruptive on both counts. I urge you to prioritise the long-term benefits of regular school attendance, over the short term impact of a holiday in term time.

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Online Safety Tip

Welcome to our 'Online Safety Tip of The Week'. On each newsletter, we will provide you with some useful hints, tips, guides and fact sheets from the National Online Safety (NOS) website that you as parents and carers will be able to use to help keep your child safe whilst online.

This week's free online safety guide focuses on LiveMe. LiveMe is a streaming video app that lets you watch live streams and broadcast your own live videos to anyone interested. The service, which is aimed at young adults aged 17+, has amassed more than sixty million global users and streams around 300,000 hours of footage a day. The app aims to give creators a "platform to reach a wide audience and share their talents and passions directly with their fans". Users can buy virtual coins and gifts and send these to broadcasters who create content "they love", which can be redeemed for real money.

Safeguarding Tip

Parental substance abuse

This week our safeguarding focus is on parental substance abuse. This is defined by the NSPCC as the long-term misuse of drugs and/or alcohol by a parent or carer. Parents and carers who misuse substances can have chaotic, unpredictable lifestyles and may struggle to recognise and meet their children's needs.

Living in a household where a parent or carer misuses substances doesn't mean a child will experience abuse, but it does make it more difficult for parents to provide safe and loving care.

This can lead to abuse or neglect. Parents and carers who misuse drugs or alcohol may also turn to crime

Skip single use plastic for lunches

Try buying foods in bulk and separating them out into smaller containers at the beginning of the week. Invite your kids to participate as an opportunity for a family activity and teach your kids the importance of reducing global plastic waste.

Chatty Toolbox software includes Chatty Nouns and Chatty Verbs which make the perfect early intervention tool to close the vocabulary gap for children who are struggling. This is also a perfect companion to Phonics as it targets comprehension and word understanding.

Chatty Nouns - The first 180 nouns






- Select Chatty Words

Early Words 1 is the first 90 nouns and Early Words 2 covers the same categories with more challenging words.

- Select Early Words 1 or Early Words 2
- Select a category to work on from the 9 displayed



The main teaching page gives you all your 'teaching' tools.

 First select Word Cards and use the spinner tool to talk about each of the nouns.

Modelling is key here - give your child as much information as possible until they develop the confidence to contribute.



Games will help your child to remember the words that they have learned.

 Choose from the games at the bottom of the teaching page.



In Word Map, you can see all the words in that category and level. If there is one in particular that your child is struggling with, fill in all the information with your child and print the screen so you can look at it regularly together - or put it on the fridge!



When you click the person icon you can access settings so that you can change the level of challenge for the Word Cards and games. You can also select to see the labels for the words.


